Is billing for travel allowed when the client / family is a "no-show" for a scheduled appointment for Family-Based Mental Health Services?

PerformCare Answer/Response:

Original clarifying information for Family-Based Mental Health Services under the feefor-service program was disseminated in 1992 under Mental Health Bulletin OMH-91-19, which is in a Q&A format. In that document, Question 47 on page 9 states that in situations where there is a no-show, "If there is a documented, planned appointment, the team or team member travelling to that appointment, may bill MA for the total amount of the travel time."

However, Appendix BB of the Program Standards and Requirements is a compendium of regulations, portions of regulations and Bulletins which were reviewed and identified as not applicable to the operation of the HealthChoices Medicaid mandatory managed care program approved through the Section 1915(b) waiver provisions of the Social

Security Act.

Appendix BB lists the regulations and policies not applicable to HealthChoices Behavioral Health. The following portions of OMH-91-19 are included on page 2 of Appendix BB:

Therefore, since P.9, #47 is specifically excluded from the HealthChoices Behavioral Health program, travel to no-show appointments is not considered billable to PerformCare
